On September 30, 2022, the \$2.5 billion Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire Assistance Act was signed to provide critical relief funding for those impacted by the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire, the largest wildfire in New Mexico history.

This financial support package, administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), compensates victims affected by these fires. FEMA is charged with receiving, processing and paying claims for damages such as loss of property, business loss, financial loss and any other damages in accordance with this Act.

Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire Timeline of Events

April 6, 2022

USFS ignites a "broadcast burn" in the Santa Fe National Forest designed to mimic low-intensity fire, help thin the forest in New Mexico, and promote forest and watershed health.

Dry conditions, relative humidity below 10%, and sustained winds of 10 to 15 miles per hour, with gusts up to 25 miles per hour cause this "prescribed burn" to quickly get out of control.

Devastates more than **300,000 acres** and destroys around **200 homes**.

April 23, 2022

The Hermit's Peak fire merges with the nearby Calf Canyon fire, resulting in the largest wildfire in New Mexico history, with more than **2,000 emergency workers** fighting the blaze.



The deadline to file a claim for relief under the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire Assistance Act.

April 11, 2022

A USFS District Ranger publicly announces that the prescribed burn it started was the cause of the Hermit's Peak wildfire.

April 19, 2022

The Calf Canyon fire starts.

September 30, 2022

President Biden signs into law the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire Assistance Act, providing **\$2.5 billion** of critical relief funding for those impacted.
